- To create a collaborative environment where volunteers can share their knowledge, experiences, and insights.






SCHEDULE


FLIPBOOK UPDATE



Abdul Sattar

Abdul Sattar Edhi is considered one of the greatest philanthropists of the 20th century. His work has inspired people around the world to work for the betterment of humanity.





Early Days

At the tender age of eleven, his mother became paralyzed and later got mentally ill. Young Abdul Sattar devoted himself to look after all her needs; cleaning, bathing and feeding. Her persistent woeful condition left a lasting impression on young Edhi.

The course of his life took a different turn from people of his age. He didn't have a normal childhood. His mother died when he was just 19.
His studies were also seriously affected and he could not complete his high school level.

Edhi and his family migrated to Pakistan in 1947. He worked in Karachi to look after his family and later with the help of his community he slowly became involved in philanthropy.



WHAT MADE ABDUL WORK FOR HUMANITY


His mother's illness planted the seeds of compassion and humanity in his heart. He started to perceive the world in a new light, and that's when he discovered the purpose of his life. His own experiences served as both his teacher and his well of knowledge. He felt personally obligated to take on the task of creating a system of services to lessen human suffering even at that young tender age. He lacked any resources, and the task was enormous. But he was willing to take every measure necessary to aid the populace. And because of his tenacity, he was able to do it.

Although he had a challenging childhood, he transformed the experience into something positive for the future.

Initial Works

Some of the initial works of Abdul Sattar Edhi, whose dedication to humanity made him a symbol of compassion and selflessness worldwide are given below:

EDHIFOUNDATION'S INCEPTION (1951)

Abdul Sattar Edhi's humanitarian journey began when he established the Edhi Foundation in 1951. Initially, it started as a small dispensary to provide medical assistance to the underprivileged in Karachi, Pakistan.

AMBULANCE SERVICES (1957)

In 1957, Edhi acquired his first ambulance, a used second-hand vehicle, to offer free ambulance services for those in need. This marked the start of his ambulance network, which would later become one of the largest volunteer ambulance organizations in the world.

ORPHANAGES (1957)

Around the same time, Edhi opened his first orphanage to provide shelter and care for orphaned children. This marked the beginning of his efforts to support abandoned and homeless children.



FREE BURIAL SERVICES (1960S)

Edhi expanded his services to include free burial services for unclaimed bodies. This compassionate initiative ensured a dignified burial for those without means or family support.



HOSPITALS AND CLINICS (1970S)

By the 1970s, Edhi had established hospitals and clinics across Pakistan, offering free medical care to those who couldn't afford it.



During the 1980s, Abdul Sattar Edhi and his foundation gained international recognition for their humanitarian work. They received numerous awards and accolades for their selfless service.

07 AMBULANCE AIR SERVICE (2005)

In 2005, Edhi introduced an air ambulance service to respond to emergencies in remote areas, further extending their reach.

08 GLOBAL OUTREACH (ONGOING)

Over the years, Edhi's foundation expanded its operations beyond Pakistan, providing relief during international disasters and crises, including earthquakes, floods, and refugee support.

The mission of the Edhi Foundation is to "provide relief to the needy and distressed without any discrimination."


The organization's motto is "Service to humanity is service to God."

This foundation has been providing its services in Karachi, Islamabad, Quetta, Peshawar, Faisalabad, Rawalpindi, Hyderabad, Multan and even other regions as well..

Performance Report of Edhi Foundation (2014)



- 335 Edhi welfare centers have provided arrangements of shrouds and baths for 2528 dead bodies of newborn kids and buried them
- 4561 abandoned dead bodies were collected upon police information and provided free of cost baths and shrouds before their burial
- 6679 girls and women along with their kids who were a victim of domestic abuse came to Edhi shelter homes
- Drug rehabilitation centers have treated 4281 drug addicts
- Edhi Free Diagnostic Center has provided free service of professional experienced doctors who have treated 52510 patients
- Edhi Free Laboratory had served 6580 kids with polio drops and 3119 kids with different disease prevention vaccines for free.
- Edhi free langars fed 657080 hungry people with food



- 335 Edhi welfare centers and 1800
 Edhi ambulances have transported
 1695091 patients intercity from hospitals to homes and from their homes to hospitals
- Edhi welfare centers issued patients with 12600 Crutches 14920 toilet chairs 5121 urine part 5910 walkers for free or at a minimum

In the later years of his life, Edhi's health had deteriorated significantly.


Edhi made a public plea for funds to support the activities of his charity despite his own health requirements. He didn't want the Edhi Foundation's services to be impacted by his own health problems.

His death was met with deep grief and a sense of loss in Pakistan. The nation mourned his passing, and his funeral was attended by thousands of people from all walks of life.

Cause of death: Kidney Failure






